The Tree of Life:

A Slide and Film Discussion

The Victoria C. G. Jung Society is pleased to present a film and discussion on the archetype of "The Tree of Life." We will examine the rich symbolism and archetypal material of The Tree as it has appeared across centuries and cultures.

We will view Terrence Malick's film, "The Tree of Life." Roger Ebert has described this film as one "of vast ambition and deep humility...and it all happens in this blink of a lifetime, surrounded by the realms of unimaginable time and space." Most of us, if we have been fortunate, share similar childhoods to the one portrayed by Malick--a childhood protected by innocence and naiveté.

The Cook Street Village Community Centre, in one of Victoria's most loved neighbourhoods, offers onsite parking. The tree-lined street is filled with cafes offering a variety of different foods. The doors will open at 10:00 for registration, and the slide presentation will begin at 10:30. Lunch is from 11:30-12:00 followed by the film and discussion period.
